


In order to provide transparency in the activities of the Fondazione for environmental matters, a permanent working group has been created with representatives of Environmental Associations, identified in partnership with the Ministry of Ecological Transition, which meets every four months. The sustainability and legacy approach of the Organising Committee has been discussed during these forums. Representatives of the national branch of Italia Nostra, one of the signatories of the letter, are included in this group.

The delivery of permanent infrastructure falls outside the direct responsibility of the Organising Committee and the IOC. The infrastructure that will be used by the Games will be delivered by a combination of Local Government Authorities and Private Investors and the *Società Infrastrutture Milano Cortina 2020 - 2026* (SIMICO). We therefore invite you to contact these entities directly in order to receive further details.

In the case of the Sliding Centre, the IOC has been clear in its position that the provision of a new sliding centre in Cortina is not a requirement for the Games. No new facility should be built without a robust and sustainable legacy operating plan in place. However, if the Region of Veneto delivers a new centre, then it shall be used during the Games.
